# VANUATU **EARTHQUAKE: PHT Reported Response Activities OCHA**

## SITUATION OVERVIEW

On December 17, 2024, a 7.3 magnitude earthquake struck 30 kilometers west of Vanuatu's capital, Port Vila, leading to widespread destruction and urgent humanitarian challenges. Occurring at a depth of 57 kilometers, the earthquake triggered landslides and caused extensive damage to homes, infrastructure, and vital services. The situation deteriorated further due to subsequent aftershocks, measuring 5.5, 4.7, and 4.9 in magnitude, according to the United States Geological Services (USGS) and the Pacific Humanitarian Team's initial report. The Ministry of Health has confirmed 14 fatalities (eight males, five females, one unknown) and 265 injuried. According to the initial reports from the Vanuatu National Emergency Operation Centre (NEOC) 80,000 people were affected by the Earthquake, leaving approximately 1,092 people currently temporarily displaced.

# SHELTER

- 2.8K Individuals affected by Damaged Houses (as of 06 January, 2025)
- 2.4K Individuals (483 HH) received Emergency Shelter Assistance i.e. 499 tarpulins, 139 shelter tool kits and 159 kitchen sets.
  - Shelter Cluster is continuing Assessments and Distribution across 8 most affected Council Areas.
  - · Shelter Cluster is coordinating with the Disaster Emergency Committee Management (DECM) to ensure required shelter assistance is provided at displacement sites.
  - The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) has deployed a Shelter Cluster coordinator to support the national shelter cluster lead.

- Mobile Storage Unit (MSU), one was set up along side 2 NEOC NDMO.

### ((†)) EMERGENCY **TELECOMMUNICATION (ETC)**

- Starlink High Kits supplied by WFP and mobilized 5 to key locations: National Disaster Management Office (NDMO) National Emergency Operation Centre (NEOC). Shefa Provincial Health Centre, Ministry of Agriculture and National Vaccine Cold Chain Centre. (as of 06 January, 2025)
- ETC Specialists deployed by WFP to support the Government in regaining connectivity through Starlink.

#### 3ð HEALTH AND NUTRITION

- 249 First Aid Kits dispatched to Ministry of Health (MoH).
- Dignity Kits and 210 Menstrual Hygiene Kits distributed 195
- Teams deployed to evacuation centres (MHPSS, 11 general outpatient care and SRH services) reaching 2.5K people.
- Emergency Medical Teams (EMT): VANMAT, AUSMAT, NZMAT, JDR, PACMAT and Indonesia. 4 Midwives mobilized to VCH, and Vanuatu Family Health Centre.
- High Performance tents provided to MoH and 2 tents 6 deployed: Vila Central Hospital (VCH). Maternity Unity and Mele Health Centre.
- Health Facilities Assessments completed. 8
- 3 Starlink Kits distributed to VCH, National Health EOC and as of 03 January, one to NCD Hub.

## FOOD SECURITY

- Water provided to communities in West Efate.
- 1.3K Household surveyed to access food, livelihoods and nutrition support.
  - 7 Days worth of food ration provided by National FSAC.
  - · WFP provided Kobo Toolbox training to staff of Ministry of Agriculture (MoA) for assessments, also providing tablets.
  - UNICEF leading a Nutrition Rapid Assessment in evacuation centres and affected communities.
  - · WVI provided monthly food vouchers to tuberculosis patients.
  - As of 30 December, FSAC members distributed (3.9MT) Rice, (3.5K) Packs of Noodles, (15.0K) Packs of Canned Fish and (3.5K) Packs of Biscuits
